Thanks to all those who have sent in items for this and future issues.


Be sure to check with hostesses of events to determine if they are still scheduled.

- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 1 20-ounce crushed pineapple, with juice
- 1/2 cup chopped nuts

2. Pour into an ungreased and unfloured 9" x 13" baknig pan.
3. Bake at 350 degrees for 35-45 min.







## **An Eagle Kiss: A Story About Jeff Guidry and His Eagle Named Freedom**

This is the kind of story you need when it seems like the world is spiraling out of control.

Not many people get a picture of this proud bird snuggled up next to them!

Freedom and I have been together 11 years this summer. She came in as a baby in 1998 with two broken wings. Her left wing doesn't open all the way even after surgery, it was broken in 4 places. She's my baby.

When Freedom came in, she could not stand. She was emaciated and covered in lice. We made the decision to give her a chance at life, so I took her to the vet's office. From then on, I was always around her. We had her in a huge dog carrier with the top off, and it was loaded up with shredded newspaper for her to lay in.

I used to sit and talk to her, urging her to live, to fight and she would lay there looking at me with those big brown eyes. We also had to tube feed her for weeks. This went on for 4-6 weeks, and by then she still couldn't stand. It got to the point where the decision was made to euthanize her if she couldn't stand in a week. You know you don't want to cross that line between torture and rehab and it looked like death was winning.

She was going to be put down that Friday and I was supposed to come in on that Thursday afternoon. I didn't want to go to the center that Thursday, because I couldn't bear the thought

of her being euthanized but I went anyway and when I walked in everyone was grinning from ear to ear. I went immediately back to her cage; and there she was, standing on her own, a big beautiful eagle. She was ready to live. I was just about in tears by then.

That was a very good day. We knew she could never fly, so the director asked me to glove train her. I got her used to the glove, and then to jesses, and we started doing education programs for schools in western Washington. We wound up in the newspapers, radio (believe it or not) and some TV. Miracle Pets even did a show about us.

In the spring of 2000, I was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's lymphoma. I had stage 3, which is not good (one major organ plus everywhere), so I wound up doing 8 months of chemo. Lost the hair - the whole bit. I missed a lot of work.

When I felt good enough, I would go to Sarvey and take Freedom out for walks. Freedom would also come to me in my dreams and help me fight the cancer. This happened time and time again.

Fast forward to November 2000. The day after Thanksgiving, I went in for my last checkup. I was told that if the cancer was not all gone after 8 rounds of chemo, then my last option was a stem cell transplant. Anyway, they did the tests and I had to come back Monday for the results. I went in Monday, and I was told that all the cancer was gone.

So the first thing I did was get up to Sarvey and take the big girl out for a walk. It was misty and cold. I went to her flight and jessed her up and we went out front to the top of the hill. I hadn't said a word to Freedom, but somehow

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she knew. She looked at me and wrapped both her wings around me to where I could feel them pressing in on my back (I was engulfed in eagle wings), and she touched my nose with her beak and stared into my eyes and we just stood there like that for I don't know how long.


That was a magical moment. We have been soul mates ever since she came in. This is a very special bird. On a side note: I have had people who were sick come up to us when we are out and Freedom has some kind of hold on them. I once had a guy who was terminal come up to us and I let him hold her.

His knees just about buckled and he swore he could feel her power course through his body. I have so many stories like that.

I never forget the honor I have of being so close to such a magnificent spirit as Freedom.

# Judy's Breast Cancer Journal

## Part 6 – Light at the End of the Tunnel



June was a very busy month with four doctor visits, a blood test and a DXA Scan. The Oncologist Hemotologist changed my estrogen blocker from Letrozole to Examestane (aka Aromasin). He also prescribed Effexor to help diminish the hot flashes. The dr. suggested I take the estrogen blocker and Effexor every other day for two weeks, then two days on and one day off. I took the first Examestane on Jun 7 without taking the Effexor. I wanted to see if I could do without the Effexor. That evening I had the mother of all hot flashes. It lasted for a full 10 minutes. I had sweat on my brow, chest and back of my neck and that was with a ceiling fan on. I took the second pill two days later along with Effexor and have done so since then. I still have hot flashes but not like that one, whew!

To prepare for radiation I had an hour-long mapping and simulation session on Jun 5. I was stomach side down on a table, with a hole for my breast, for the first 45 minutes as my body was run back and forth through something like the hole in a huge donut. After a half hour of that, my breast, torso and back were marked with permanent marker x's, lines and arrows. The second part of the mapping was 15 minutes on my back and I was run back and forth through the machine again. This was followed by more markings and waterproof stickers over every marking. I was informed that the radiation oncology team needed a week and a half to evaluate the best way to for me to receive radiation (on my stomach or on my back) and how much radiation I would receive.

Radiation began on Jun 17. My Radiation Oncologist popped in to see how all was going. The first day took 15 minutes to get me lined up and then zapped. I was given my schedule, which was 11 AM every weekday through Jul 8 (except Jul 3, which is a holiday).

So far, I have had ten radiation sessions, with five more to go. I see the Radiation Oncologist every Wed after treatment. The nurse checks my weight and asks a load of health questions, then the doctor examines the breast to monitor any changes (coloring, shrinkage, ...) and to answer any questions I have. Each session has increased the pinking of my skin on the breast and under my arm. I have been able to wear a bra to get to the center, where I change into a scrubs top. After the first few days of treatment I took the bra off when I got home. After today's treatment (Jun 30), I will not be able to wear the bra until the pain goes away. The skin has deepened to a rose color and has burned like a sunburn since last Thurs (Jun 25). Per instruction, I apply Eucerin cream twice a day. It is to help keep the skin moist so it doesn't chafe. It does nothing for the burn pain. Sleeping is difficult. I have five more sessions to go. I hope that I don't get blisters as do some women.

I must say, the technicians are excellent. They put on my preferred music (meditation) when I arrive in the treatment area. They place a pillow, designed especially for me at the simulation session, on the table. It's hard as a rock but it helps keep my arms straight back. I have a rotator cuff problem on my left shoulder and it has been painful since Day 1 for me to extend my left arm back. Last week I asked if the tech could put something under my arm so it was not hanging in the air. That was most helpful. I have stopped taking the Tramadol that the Radiation Oncologist prescribed on the first day to help with shoulder pain. All it did was make me sleep for 6 hours when I got home.

I have a meeting with the Oncologist Hemotologist next Monday to evaluate how my body is handling Examestane and Effexor. I

have had several side effects that come and go. I'm not sure if they will come and stay once I am taking the stuff every day. Hopefully my body has gradually adjusted to the new meds and I will be able to stay on them for the next five years.

I joined a Living with Cancer Support Group that Zooms every Tuesday evening. It has been most helpful. There are both men and women in the group with various types and stages of cancers. The drugs, treatments, side-effects seem to be the same or very similar for everyone. It has been helpful to know I am not alone with my problems and concerns.

I thank everyone who sent me an e-mail, a card, a call and who prayed for me. They have been wonderful to lift me, especially on the bad days.

**For those struggling with an illness:** "Keep your head up; keep fighting. There is always light at the end of the tunnel and your struggles only make you better in the end."

I know I will come out of this much stronger than before. It's just that getting there has been a path of disbelief, tears, decisions, more tears, uncertainty, then treatments. It all became much easier once I joined the support group. If you are struggling with cancer, I strongly encourage you to find a support group. We laugh and cry together, we pray for one another, we lift up each others spirits, we share our struggles, our problems with meds or body issues. The support groups are run by trained people, some who have had cancer themselves.

Our loved ones might be loving us throughout our ordeal but unless they have had cancer,

they can't possibly understand what feelings, internal struggles and side effects you are going through. The loved ones too are going through some struggles too – dealing with your cancer struggle. Encourage them to join a support group for caregivers.

Next month I hope to say "I am a cancer survivor."
